# Shettleston Policing Plan.

In 2009 we carried out a consultation exercise to discover the issues that mattered most to members of the community in Shettleston. These concerns formed the basis of the policing plan we have been working on for the past year. You will have recently been updated on the results of our activities.

To ensure we continue to address the issues that are relevant to our community, we have again conducted a public consultation survey in your area. This consultation has identified our priorities for the coming year.

This policing plan sets out how we intend to deal with those priorities.

## Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for the Shettleston area were:

### 1. Drunk or disorderly behaviour

You told us that there were problems with street drinking, youth disorder, drunk and disorderly behaviour, vandalism and graffiti.

### 2. Assault/violent crime

You told us that you were concerned about violent crime and the negative impact on your community.

### 3. Drug dealing and drug use

You told us that you were concerned about the levels of drug abuse and dealing in drugs which affects your community.

### 4. Housebreaking and other thefts

You told us that you were concerned about the level of housebreaking and acquisitive crimes that occur in your area.

We've listened to your concerns and you'll hopefully have seen improvements in the Shettleston area.



# Actions carried out to date.

- Community police officers have carried out high visibility patrols in identified 'hot spots' within your area.
- We have attended at public meetings to find out about local concerns and how the police can strive to make your community safer.
- In partnership with local Housing Associations and Glasgow Community and Safety Services, we have identified and challenged those engaged in criminality, such as antisocial behaviour.
- We have conducted numerous operations with partners, such as 'Operation Cleansweep' which targeted violent crime, drug use and dealing, speeding motorists and drunk or disorderly behaviour.
- A 'dispersal zone' was created in your area which tackled unacceptable levels of antisocial behaviour and violent disorder. This resulted in a reduction in crime and the fear of crime.
- We organised a Domestic Abuse Awareness Day as part of our commitment to tackling domestic abuse, to reduce the harm it causes to communities.

## In the coming months you will see a number of new initiatives being employed:

- We will continue with daily patrols in your area, on foot and bicycles, to reduce drunk and disorderly behaviour (including vandalism and graffiti), providing public reassurance.
- We will continue to regularly visit and supervise licensed premises to reduce violent crime, assaults and drunken behaviour.
- We will continue to disrupt the illegal sale or supply of alcohol to young people and proactively target drinking in public.
- Through intelligence-led operations, we will continue to target known drug dealers and those who abuse drugs in your area.
- We will continue to deter, disrupt and detect those individuals involved in all forms of acquisitive crime, including housebreaking and theft.
- We will be working with our partner agencies to make visible and sustainable improvements to your area.
